

Ambulance Services Trial for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander People in WA

- From now until and 31 December 2026 St John ambulance services in Western Australia will be more accessible for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people.
- As part of a trial, Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people in WA who are aged 50 years and older will receive concessions on medically necessary St John Ambulance services.
- For pensioners who are 50 years and older, ambulances will be free where medically necessary.
- For non-pensioners aged 50 years and older, 50 per cent of the ambulance cost will be subsidised, where medically necessary.
- To access this concession, make sure you tell your ambulance officer that you are Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander and give them your pension number if you have one.
- If you are too unwell to provide this information to your ambulance officer, you can call St John WA when you receive the bill on (08) 9334 1212 or at billing@stjohnwa.com.au to let them know and have your bill fixed.
